

Notice of EA Process Closure
Long-Term Water Utility Master Plan

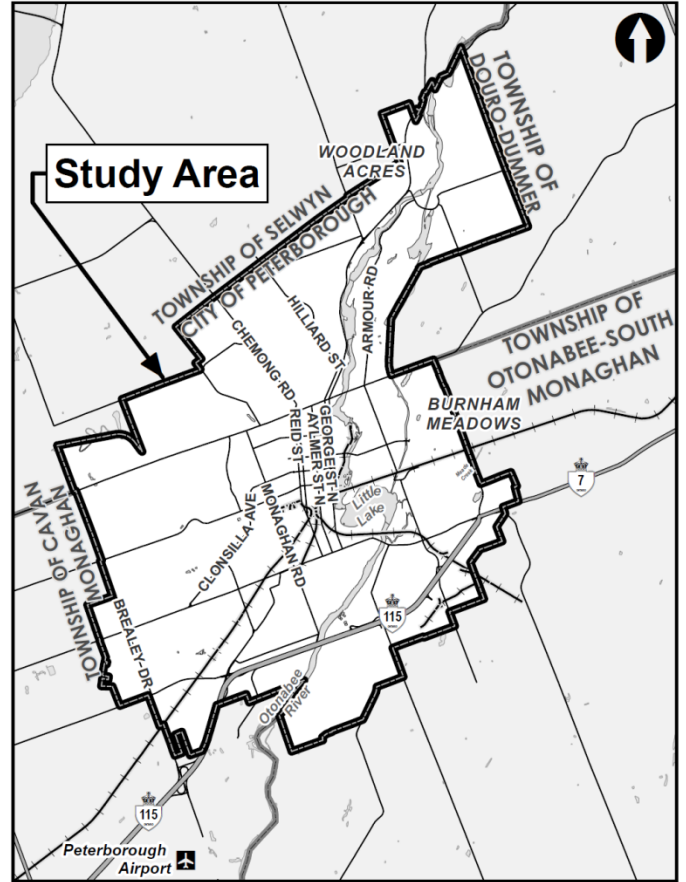
The Study

In June 2018, The Peterborough Utilities Commission (PUC) initiated a Long-Term Water Utility Master Plan (the Master Plan) study to provide an efficient and cost effective maintenance and expansion program for the municipal potable water supply system in the City of Peterborough to meet expected growth. The Master Plan, developed in the context of projections on water quality and quantity over the next 15 years to 2031, identifies the preferred water supply and servicing strategy, including associated capital upgrades.

The Process

The Master Plan was being planned to address the requirements of the first two phases of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) manual (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015) for Schedule B projects, which is approved under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*.

The PUC has concluded that the proposed water system distribution improvements, including pumping facility upgrades, rehabilitation of the High Street Elevated Tank, and new water mains, are all Schedule A or A+ projects. Schedule A+ projects are pre-approved subject to public notification prior to implementation. As such, there will be no further consultation, including Public Information Centres or Master Plan documentation review.
